Living with Purpose, Peace, and Provision

I've lived through seasons where every dollar had to stretch farther than reason said it could. Times when I stared at the numbers and thought, "There's no way this will work." And yet, somehow, it always did. God has never failed to provide—sometimes through open doors, sometimes through unexpected hands, and sometimes through lessons I didn't want to learn.
